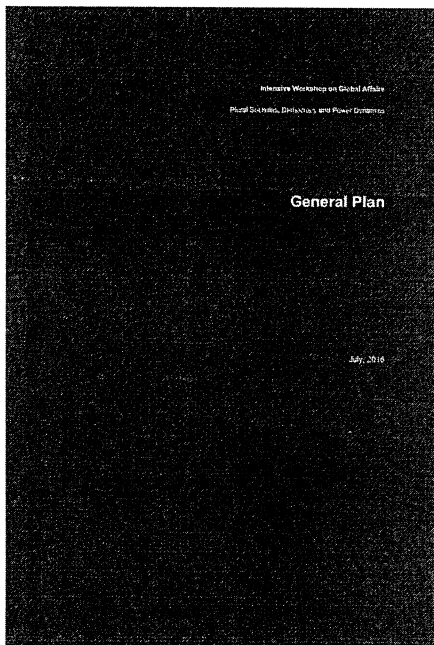
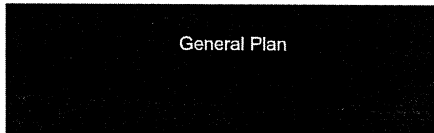
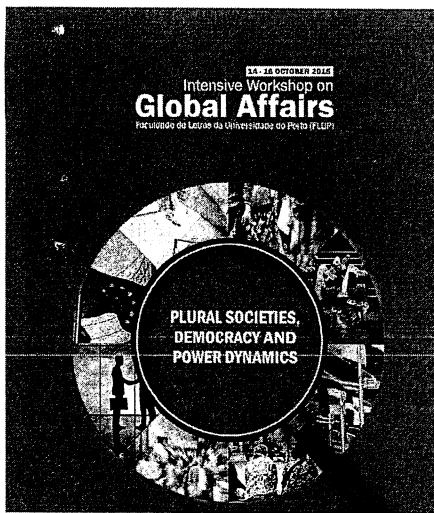

2. Sessions	
2.1. Self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood	
• October 14th, Sala de Reuniões, 8.30 – 11.00	
• Professor Doctor Didiem Buhari	
• Summary:	
As a central topic on world politics, the question of self-determination determines which actors exist and how they relate to one another in the global arena. The United Nations Charter stipulates the aim to 'develop friendly relations among nations based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples, and to take other appropriate measures to strengthen universal peace (Article 1(2), emphasis added). However, researchers of self-determination movements encounter the paradox that some political communities who succeed their de facto states – in terms of population, government, and territory – fail to receive international recognition (known as 'contested states') whereas some others who lack actual capabilities to establish a state (called 'failed states') receive the stamp of statehood. For instance, the post-war decolonisation period saw the accession of the title of statehood in a 'casual', 'mechanical', and wholesale manner (Faber 2010: 186; Hironaka 2005).	
The prevailing scholarship on state recognition correctly highlights that it is neither purely a legal enterprise nor a direct product of strategic bargains among great powers; instead, it is the United Nations (UN) – an institution legitimising uncertainty in terms of representing world public opinion (Claude 1986: 372) – which plays a central role in providing the 'final certificate of real statehood' to emerging political communities (Goldsmiths 2009: 233). However, the UN's selective application of the principle of self-determination remains puzzling.	
By focusing on the selected self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood such as Kosovo, Crimea and North Cyprus, it becomes possible to find different cases where the European Union (EU) has been influential and to study domestic, regional and global dynamics underlying self-determination movements and the variety of responses (recognition, non-recognition, engagement without recognition etc.) they provoke in the pan-European-wide state, neighbour states, the European Union, the UN and the international community.	
This lecture aims to introduce various key concepts and approaches related to self-determination and state recognition in order to raise different questions such as:	
• Why do some nations seek international recognition as an independent state while others remain within the boundaries of another state?	
• How do the international community and the European Union approach the issue of self-determination? Why are some cases treated differently?	
• Which theoretical approaches can be employed to explain the selective approach of the UN towards self-determination?	
• Which research methods are useful to investigate the topic of self-determination?	
At the end of the lecture, the participants will (1) have a critical understanding of the self-determination movements in the world in general and in the European neighbourhood in particular; (2) will be more familiar with the analytical and methodological tools available to researchers of self-determination; and (3) will be better equipped to apply conceptual and theoretical approaches to different, real-world examples.

2.2. Self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood – perspective-taking exercises	
• October 14th, Sala de Reuniões, 11.30 – 13.00	
• Professor Doctor Didiem Buhari	
• Summary:	
This seminar is an interactive session that gives participants the opportunity to engage in theoretically-informed critical debates about international cases of self-determination in the European neighbourhood. In addition to sharing their own international experiences, the participants will 'learn by doing' through perspective-taking exercises that give the opportunity to reflect upon the stance of a contested state, parent state, the international community and the European Union.	
The key aim of the seminar is to ensure that key concepts and problems related to self-determination are clearly understood and applied to different international cases. Hence, the participants will be able to apply theoretical and technical knowledge they acquire during the lecture to contemporary issues of world politics; take different critical perspectives while contributing to group discussions; and to develop their knowledge on the prevailing debates about self-determination, sovereignty and state recognition in Political Science and International Relations through peer feedback and class discussions.	
The tutor acts as a 'facilitator' who (1) briefly introduces the main guidelines and objectives of the seminar, (2) helps form sub-groups within the class, (3) allocates different roles and cases to groups and individuals, and (4) localises the group and class discussions by raising specific and general questions.	
The seminar will use audio-visual materials and handouts.	

2.3. EU's role in international security

- Professor Doctor Christian Kaunert
- Summary:

This lecture will look at the nature of international security and at the specific place for Europe as an actor in international security. It will look specifically at the EU's role in international security from a theoretical (IR constructionist), as well as empirical angle. In doing so, it will examine policy areas, such as terrorism and counter-terrorism, peaking, criminal justice, as well as asylum, migration and border policies, alongside more recent examples of environmental security, countering piracy, etc.

- Summary:

This session will look at a specific security crisis in Europe and will simulate negotiations to illustrate Europe's contribution to international relations. The session leader will provide a fictitious security scenario, which can be simulated by the students.

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4. Procedures and deadlines

By applying, participants are acknowledging they are aware of all the procedures involved with their participation, i.e.:

- Sending a full paper (between 3000 and 4000 words)
- Reading the peers' papers (they will have to comment on them and to ask questions to all the colleagues in their focus groups – max. of 8 participants per focus group)
- Repeating and paying the fee within the deadlines
- Depending on the supervisors of the practical sessions, reading extra materials.

For the initial application, applicants will need to send per e-mail:

- 1-page document with basic information: Name, contacts, affiliation, status (PhD student/young researcher, etc.).
- 1-page summary of the project/paper/article they will send, including clear references to the subject under study, objectives and methodological aspects.
- Max. 2-page CV.
- Max. 1-page Letter of motivation to participate in the Workshop.

Applicants who are selected to participate in the Workshop will be required to send:

- Full paper/project/article (between 3000 and 4000 words, excluding bibliography)

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5.2. Christian Kaunert | University of Dundee

Prof. Christian Kaunert is Jean Monnet Professor in EU Justice and Home Affairs (July 2013) as well as Professor in International Relations & Politics (Oct 2013). He was previously Senior Lecturer at the University of Dundee, Marie Curie Senior Research Fellow at the European University Institute, Florence, and Senior Lecturer in EU Politics & International Relations, University of Salzburg. He has been awarded with a prestigious Juan March Chair in EU Justice and Home Affairs Policy (in July 2013), and received a prestigious Marie Curie Career Integration Grant (from 2012-2016), the latter to be held at the University of Dundee. He has also previously been the Editor of the Journal of Contemporary European Research (JCEUR), on the Executive Committee member of the University Association for Contemporary European Studies (UACES), and an Expert for the European Parliament. He is also on the editorial board of the Journal Perspectives on European Politics and Society (PEPS). His successful application for a Marie Curie Senior research fellowship at the EUJ was ranked in the top 1% of all applicants received (98.2% as final score). Prof. Kaunert holds a PhD in International Politics & an MSc in European Politics from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth, a BA (Hons) European Business from Dublin City University, ESJ Reutlingen and a BA (Hons) Open University.



Prof. Kaunert has researched and taught in many international departments, such as Aberystwyth (Wales); ULB Brussels (Belgium), 2004; UACES Research Fellow, Manchester (Manchester); Suffolk (England); EUJ Florence (Marie Curie Fellowship), as well as a guest professor in Barcelona (Spain), Turin (Italy); Yerevan (Armenia), at the UNDP mission, Cairo (Egypt), and Jilin (China). Prof. Kaunert has acted as primary PhD supervisor to 11 PhD students successfully, with 6 PhD candidates already successfully completed. His research has a clear focus on the Global Security risks of the EU, especially in the area of EU Justice and Home Affairs, including its external dimension, Terrorism and Counter-terrorism, and International Relations more generally. He is the author of several articles on EU Justice and Home Affairs, EU counter-terrorism, EU asylum and migration, and wider EU global security matters. His articles have appeared in journals, such as European Security, Journal of European Integration, Journal of European Public Policy, Terrorism and Political Violence, Studies in Conflict and Terrorism, Perspectives on European Politics and Society, European Political Science, and the Journal of Contemporary European Research. His monograph 'Terrorism: Internal Security: towards supranational governance' has been published with Manchester University Press.

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5. Keynote speakers

5.1. Didem Buhari-Gulmez | London School of Economics

Dr. Didem Buhari-Gulmez is a RCUK research fellow at London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE), UK. Before LSE, Didem worked as an Energy Researcher Fellow at Oxford Brookes University, UK. She received her PhD from the Department of Politics and International Studies at Royal Holloway University of London in 2012 (partly sponsored by Royal Holloway, Queen's University Belfast and the Department of Politics and International Studies from the University of Edinburgh in Scotland, UK and LSE degree in International Relations from Middle East Technical University, Turkey). She also received a diploma and articles, scholarships equivalent of a higher education diploma) in International Relations from the Paris Institut d'Études de Relations Internationales et Sociologiques (IPRIS) after the completion of her studies (in French) sponsored by Jean Monnet research fellowship in 2005. Didem worked as a parliamentary advisor in the Turkish Grand National Assembly in 2005 and as a research assistant in Istanbul Tuzen University in 2007. During her doctoral studies, Didem was a visiting fellow at the School of International Studies, School of History and Sociology in Germany and a visiting researcher at the Centre for European Studies of the Middle East Technical University. Didem has published academic journal articles and book chapters on globalisation, World Policy theory, Europeanisation and Turkey's European Union membership process. She is currently studying self-determination movements in Kosovo, Northern Cyprus and Crimea with a focus on the effects of globalisation and the relationship between localisation and globalisation.
