Background

Young scientists are future world leaders who need to be prepared to overcome global problems. This idea was the main concern that led Prof. Nobutaka ITO and Prof. Seizo KATO from Faculty of Bio Engineering – Mie University, Japan to initiate a forum called “The Tri-U International Joint Seminar & Symposium (Tri-U IJSS)” in 1994. This annual event is conducted to expose young scientists to have international experiences while enriching their knowledge and widening their views through information exchanges of scientific and cultural experiences. Through intensive interaction and friendly atmosphere, the participants representing young scientists from various countries are expected to be able to create peace in the world by having mutual respect and understanding (culture, religion, and custom/behavior).

The global problem faced worldwide has been the dramatic increase of population, which then led to the problems of the food security and sufficiency, as well as of increasing energy demand and of disturbed environment. Thus, these four important issues are the annual topics discussed at Tri-U IJSS: population, food, energy and environment. Every year there are five topics covered in the Tri-U IJSS. The fifth topic is decided by the host.

The three universities – Mie University, Japan; ChiangMai University, Thailand; and JiangSu University, China – are the founder universities of Tri-U IJSS; and therefore, the event was named “Tri-University International Joint Seminar and Symposium”. Bogor Agricultural University (IPB) started to join this event in 2003 and has been

participating continually since then. Due to this consistent participation and its good achievement the participating students have shown, IPB was accepted as the 4th founder university in 2010 and first hosted the 19th Tri-U IJSS in 2012. This year IPB will become the host for the second time for the 23rd Tri-U IJSS in October.

Theme

The theme for this year's Tri-U IJSS is **Asian Contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals**.

Topics

This year's topics covered in the Tri-U International Joint Seminar & Symposium are:

(1) Population, (2) Food, (3) Energy, (4) Environment, and (5) Bioinformatics

These topics are strongly related to each other and are all important for sustainable harmonious development and the survival of human beings. Technologies and social understanding can be the keys to achieve such development and sustain better survival. They play an important role for improved situation, and better future. Since the 21st century is expected to be the era of Asia, it is a good and invaluable opportunity to promote the mutual understanding and collaboration in preparing the counter measures for the forthcoming era.

Activities

Joint Seminar & Symposium

The program is composed of some keynote speeches from the Tri-U founder universities and invited speakers, several keynote lectures from distinguished scholars, as well as more than 80 oral and poster presentations from students in parallel sessions.

Student Workshop

Students from different universities collaborate and share their innovative and original ideas to solve some challenging problems through active participation and intensive discussion.

Forum

Rector forum, keynote person meeting and alumni forum are organized to discuss important issues and establish new potential collaboration to assure program sustainability.

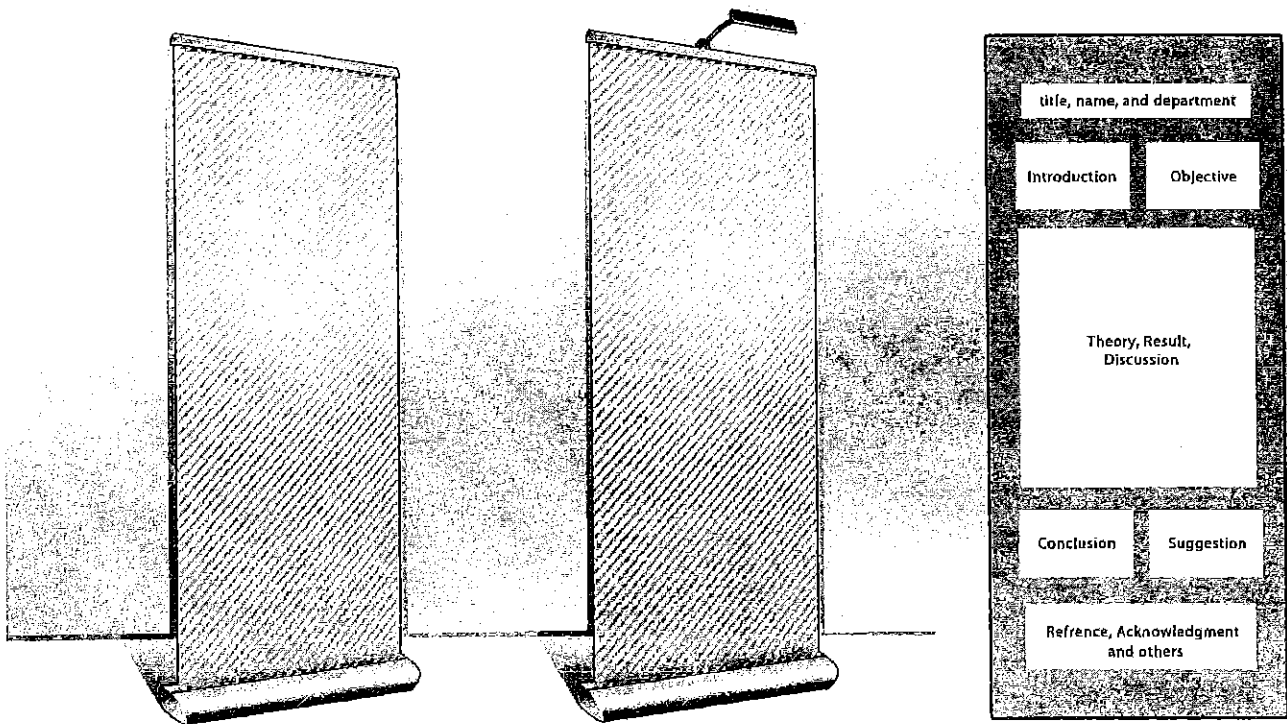
The Tri-U Joint Seminar & Symposium: Guidelines for Banner Preparation

General aim and format

- A banner is a graphically based approach to present research. In presenting your research in a banner, you should aim to use the banner as a means of generating active discussion of the research.
- Limit the text and use "visuals" (graphs, photographs, schematics, maps, etc.) to tell your "story."

Design and layout specifications

- The entire banner must be mounted on a 60 x 160 cm (300 dpi) paper. The banner does not necessarily have to fill the entire working area.
- The board must be oriented in the "portrait" position (long dimension is vertical).
- A banner displaying your banner title, name, and department (or class, if appropriate) should be positioned at top-center of the board. Introduction, Objective, Theory, Result, Discussion, Conclusion, Suggestion and Acknowledgment make it obvious to the viewer on how to progressively view the banner. The banner generally should read from left to right, and top to bottom.
- Print on albatross paper with a digital printer and roll up the banner cover.



Lettering

- Texts should be readable from five meters away. Use a *minimum* font size of 18 points.
- Lettering for the title should be large (at least 70-point font).

Visuals

- Present numerical data in the form of graphs, rather than tables (graphs make trends in the data much more evident). If data must be presented in table-form, KEEP THEM SIMPLE.
- Visuals should be simple and bold. Leave out or remove any unnecessary detail.
- Make sure that any visual can "stand alone" (i.e. graph axes are properly labeled, maps have north arrows and distance scales, symbols are explained, etc.).
- Use color to enhance comprehension, not to decorate the banner.

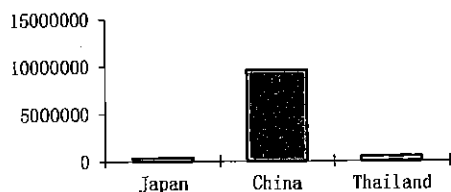


Fig. 1 Comparison of area of Japan, China and Thailand

- Make sure that the text and the visuals are integrated. Figures should be numbered consecutively according to the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Each visual should have a *brief* title (for example: Figure 1- Location of study area).

Text

- Keep the text brief. Blocks of text should not exceed three paragraphs (viewers won't bother to read more than that). Use texts to (a) introduce the study (what hypothesis was tested or what problem was investigated? why was the study worth doing?), (b) explain visuals and direct viewers' attention to significant data trends and relationships portrayed in the visuals, and (c) state and explain the interpretations that follow from the data. In many cases, conclusions can be summarized in a bullet-point list.
- Depending upon the stage or nature of your project, the text could also include sections on future research plans or questions for discussion with viewers.
- Cite and reference any source of information other than your own, just as you would do with a research paper. Ask your professor about the particular citation system that you should use (every discipline uses slightly different styles). The "References Cited" is placed at the end of the banner.

Miscellaneous Suggestions

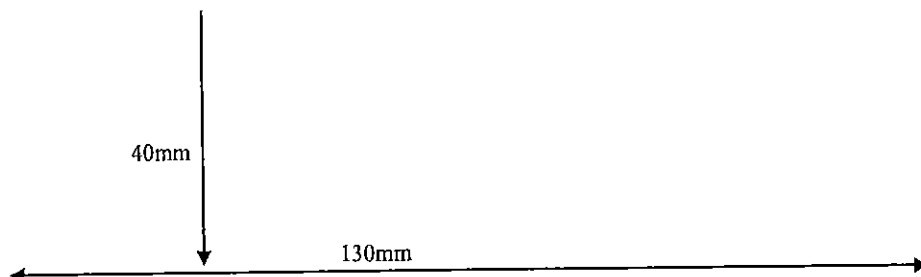
- SIMPLICITY IS THE KEY. Keep to the point, and don't try to cover too many things. Present only enough data to support your conclusions. On the other hand, make sure that you present sufficient data to support your conclusions.
- If you need the assistance from the committee member to do the banner printing for you, please send your file in JPG High Resolution Format to email : triu@apps.ipb.ac.id before 30 August 2016. The printing costs IDR 450,000 per banner. You can pay this amount at your arrival.

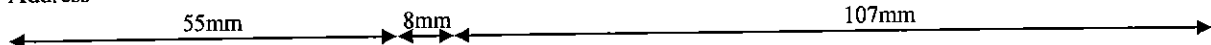

ABSTRACT (12PT,BOLD) For the paper title a) use 12 pt Times New Roman with bold font; b) the title of a paper should be all typed in capital letters; c) leaving blank space of 30mm above the title of paper; d) centering the title. For the author, affiliation and address a) use 10 pt Times New Roman font with bold font at the author's name; b) the author's name is below the title with 2-line space between them; c) the author's affiliation is placed under the author's name; d) keep 1-line space between each author's name and affiliation. Last, for the abstract, a) use 10 pt Times New Roman font; b) only 200 words are allowed in this box;



1. PAPER LENGTH

The length of the paper should not exceed 4 pages. This includes all the content of figure, table, reference, and authors' photograph.

(b) For the 2nd level heading (Subsection), the first letter must be capital (see an example in subsection 2.1). The serial number style the subsection number is x.y where x is the section number and y is the subsection number.

(c) The 3rd level heading (Subsection) uses the English alphabets in parenthesis to sequence the subsubsection e.g. (a), (b), (c), ...

2. PAPER STYLE

2.1 Paper size

The size of the paper is A4 (210mm×297mm). Please leave blank space of 20mm from bottom, 25mm from top of the paper, except 40mm for the first page. For the left and right side, also leave 20mm blank space. The content must appear in two columns with 8mm space between them.

4. EQUATION

Number displayed equations consecutively from Eq (1) to the end of the paper. As shown, enclose equations number in round parentheses and place them flush-right in the column. When referring to an equation in the text write "Eq.(1)"

Language and font

Language of this paper is English. 10 pt. Either American or British English is allowed, but it must be consistent throughout the paper. One line of space should be inserted at the end of each section.

3. THE HEADINGS

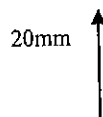
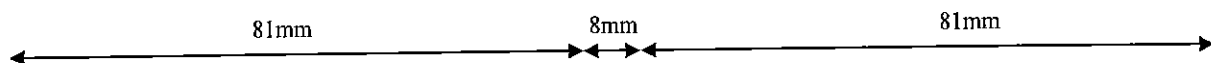
The style of each level of the heading is as follows:

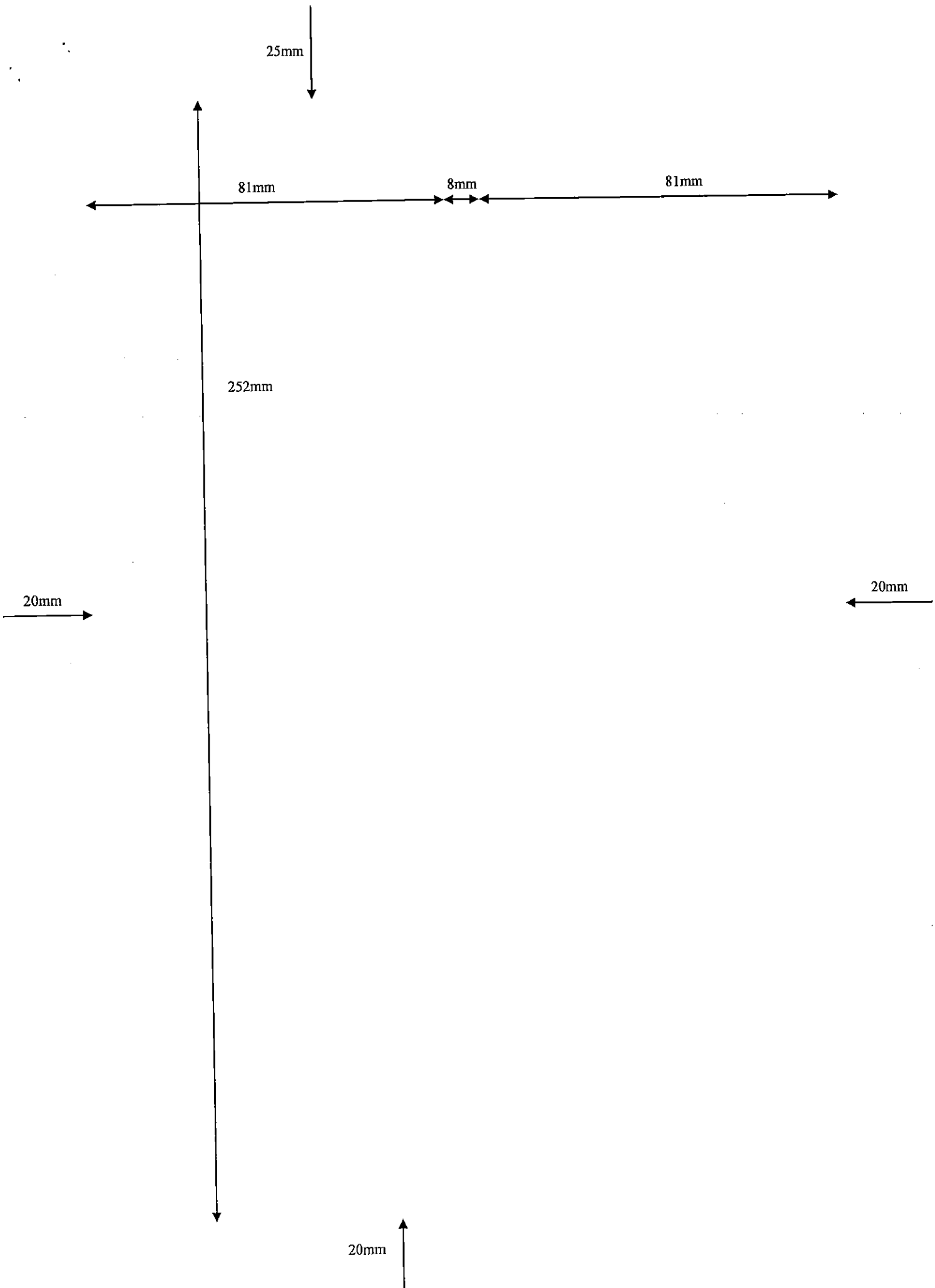
- (a) For the 1st level heading (Section), Times New Roman must be used with all words in capital letters. The serial number is the form of 1, 2, 3, ...

5. FIGURE, TABLE AND PICTURE

The photo/figure should be in high resolution (>200 dpi) with gray-scale color. The table should be placed in the same page of its referring text. It can be arranged in the following page, if needed because of limited space.

Table y, where x and y is the sequence number. The photo/figure caption must be centered at the bottom of the photo/figure. For each table, its caption must be left margined and placed at the top of the table. Both types of caption must have the first letter capital.

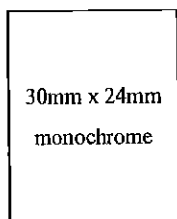
